

TRINITY PARK PLANT SELECTION INFORMATION

Name: Acacia Lasiocarpa

A low, spreading wattle with soft grey-green foliage and bright yellow flowers in winter and spring. It is hardy, drought tolerant and ideal for groundcover or erosion control. *Image source: Wattle - Acacias of Australia*



Name: Acacia pulchella

A small, prickly wattle with fine green leaves and golden ball-shaped flowers in spring. It offers shelter for small birds and wildlife. *Image source: Muchea Tree Farm*



Name: Agonis flexuosa

A medium to large tree with weeping branches and peppermint-scented leaves. Well suited to coastal conditions, it provides shade and habitat for birds. *Image source: Australian Native Plants Society*



Name: Banksia attenuata

A tall shrub or small tree with narrow leaves and pale yellow flower spikes. Very drought-tolerant, it is an important food source for birds and pollinators. *Image source: Geographe Community Landcare Nursery*



Name: Banksia grandis

A large, long-lived tree with broad leaves and striking yellow flower spikes. Provides excellent habitat and food for birds, possums and insects. *Image source: ReWild Perth*



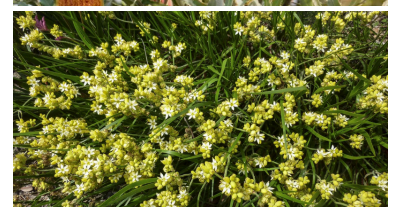
Name: Banksia littoralis

A medium tree with dark green leaves and golden flower spikes. Valuable for supporting birdlife and pollinators in low-lying areas. *Image source: Lnj GARDEN*



Name: Conostylis aculeata

A low-growing plant with grassy leaves and bright yellow flowers in spring. Well suited to sandy soils and adds colour to gardens with minimal water needs. *Image source: Australian Plants Society NSW*



Name: Corymbia calophylla

A large native tree with rough bark and creamy white flowers. Produces large seed pods and provides significant habitat and food for wildlife. *Image source: EUCLID - Eucalypts of Australia*



Name: Daviesia physodes

A small shrub with distinctive inflated pods and colourful red and yellow flowers. Adds visual interest and supports native insects. *Image source: Friends of Queens Park Bushland*



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Name: Dianella revoluta

A hardy, clumping plant with strap-like leaves and small blue flowers. Produces purple berries and is ideal for mass planting and low-maintenance gardens. *Image source: Oz Trees*



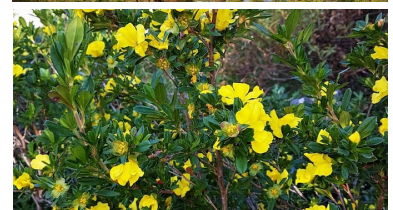
Name: Eucalyptus gomphocephala

A tall, iconic tree with pale bark and a broad canopy. Highly valued for shade, habitat and its role in local ecosystems. *Image source: Honkey Nuts*



Name: Hibbertia cuneiformis

A low shrub with glossy green leaves and bright yellow flowers. Excellent for groundcover and attracting pollinators. *Image source: Lake Treeby*



Name: Jacksonia furcellata

A fine-textured shrub with small yellow pea flowers. Tough and drought-resistant, it works well in naturalistic landscapes. *Image source: Geographe Community Landcare Nursery*



Name: Juncus pallidus

A tufted rush suited to damp areas and water-sensitive urban design. Helps stabilise soil and improve water quality. *Image source: Leschanault Community Nursery Inc.*



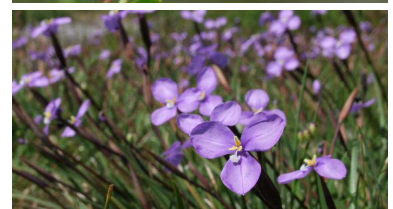
Name: Lysiandra calycina

A small shrub with delicate pink to purple flowers. Well suited to sandy soils and adds soft colour to native gardens. *Image source: Atlas of Living Australia*



Name: Patersonia occidentalis

A clumping plant with iris-like purple flowers in spring. Ideal for borders and understory planting in low-water gardens. *Image source: ReWild Perth*



Name: Spyridium globulosum

A dense shrub with silvery foliage and small white flower clusters. Provides shelter for small birds and tolerates coastal conditions. *Image source: Honkey Nuts*



Name: Xanthorrhoea brunonis

A slow-growing iconic plant with a grass-like crown and tall flower spike. Extremely hardy and long-lived, it provides habitat and visual character. *Image source: Whiteman Park - Department of Western Australia*
